# DATA, DIANETICS AND BRIDGES

Dianetics is a bridge to a better future, greater happiness and security. So says Hubbard. How big a bridge is it? Is it a modern four lane highway bridge, or is it only a footpath bridge? To date there is no engineering data on this bridge. Let's get it!

You as auditors are doing the most important job in the world today: creating a psychological revolution in mankind. But who knows about your results? No one but us! We're hiding our light under a basket. As auditors we're failing to do our job unless we tell others about Dianetics and its successes. As auditors we miss the boat unless we engage in, actively push, and 100% cooperate on a records research program on a large scale.

Hubbard is currently publicizing the communications aspects in processing. I heartily agree. Communication is another sine qua non in Dianetics (the first is auditors). If there are no engineering data as to where this bridge can take you, how many people can use it, and what you leave behind when you cross, nobody will use our better bridge. Communication about Dianetics and its potentials doesn't exist on a large scale. Sure, Hubbard talks about Dianetics, and keeps on talking. Sure, we all have told each other and a few friends how good Dianetics is. But we haven't made any concerted large scale effort to present Dianetics in a respectable fashion as it really is to the public. This, I say, we should do, and it's high time we got started!

The Records Research Program. It sounds simple, doesn't it? The idea is simple. Wherever possible, the collection of standardized data on every pre-clear. Before, after, and follow-up records.

Physical examinations and psychological tests. A lot of work? You said it! But it takes a lot of engineering data to build a bridge, too. A lot of time? The first possible report is a year away. But anything really worth doing takes time and effort.

Details of operation: The Quik Chek Personal Inventory is designed to use the least amount of time of you auditors and yet collect comprehensive data on your pre-clears in a standard form. Writing is minimized, facts about your pc's are checked off with an "x". Processing results, and before- and after- records are conveniently recordable. The list of your pre-clear's aberrations is easily checked off. This is how the Quik Chek Personal Inventory makes it easy for you to record, collect, and report the pertinent details about pre-clears.

Let me give an example of what having data can do. Last spring, a personnel psychologist and I developed a tentative accident prone scale. As a result, we now have a good start towards being able to predict reliably the industrial workers who are likely to have accidents. From management's viewpoint, this is highly desirable.

Recently, desiring to do further research along the accident prone line, I approached an organization here. Have you ever had a day when everything you did went right? This was such a day for me. With the data from this previous accident prone study, the organization approached here was eager to get started on a similar project to adapt an accident prone scale for their own use.

So it is with Dianetics. (Cont. on P 6)

# CADA MARCH MEETING: S E X

The program of the March meeting of the C.A.D.A. had been announced as a discussion of the "2nd Dynamic, Part One: Sex".

Laeta Dunbar began with a review of Dr. Rudolf von Urban's book, "Sex Perfection and Marital Happiness", selected for the program because of its many apparent parallels to concepts of dianetics and scientology. The author had devoted many years to the study of psychology, psychiatry and sexology before writing an easily understood and sincere treatment of the "reason for dissonance between couples, electrical affinities, birth control, talking to children about sex, sex development of children, the problem of masturbation, impotency, frigidity, the principles and errors of love choice, and many questions and answers on sexual problems, together with case histories". The development of perfection in mature sexual relationships, according to von Urban, depends on the utilization of an apparent difference in bio-electrical potentials existing in male and female bodies. An exchange between these potentials takes place in proper sex union, and von Urban presents principles, the careful observation of which are stated to lead to complete sexual harmony, in turn providing the basis for the security and satisfaction needed by the marriage partners and their children in their home life.

L. O. Anderson followed the review of the book with a discussion of the manner in which he uses the book as a supplement to processing. The reaction to individual ideas advanced by von Urban is, he explained, frequently a rather violent one, so he strongly recommends having preclears read the entire book instead of jumping to "the rules" of

sexual perfection. Particularly desirable, he said, was to induce marriage partners to read the book together, alternating in reading sections of it aloud, this process tending to dissolve embarrassments, mutual secrecy and resentments on the subject of sex. To attempt to carry out the sexual principles advanced by von Urban after a single hasty reading was likely to lead to disappointments arising out of inadequate understanding.

The most important single contribution of the book, in the speaker's opinion, is that it adds the goal of reduction of physical and emotional tensions to the goals of reproduction and pleasure in sexual relations. The deferring of the orgasm, as advocated by von Urban, permits a nightly dispersal of tensions, so that in effect the individual who follows von Urban's principles begins each morning in a temporarily "released" condition.

Referring to scientological theory, the speaker pointed out that von Urban's principles produce a flow between two energy terminals as a part of mature sexual perfection, as against the immature "single-terminal" activity of masturbation. The Nirvana-like sense of complete relaxation achieved he compared to effects obtained in exteriorization.

Therapy, he stated, could be thought of as comprising at least two parts: eliminating compulsive behavior and straight education in non-compulsive areas. The utilization of this book as an adjunct to processing fitted into the latter category. Various specific chapters relieve specific areas of guilt and ignorance and increase (continued on page 6)

# CADA APRIL MEETING: *Family*

The theme of the April meeting of the CADA was the family relations aspect of the 2nd Dynamic in processing and the processing of children.

Martha Nolte discussed specific techniques she had used over a period of some years to resolve the problems of young children and teen-agers. They included attention unit processing, the use of energy flows and matched terminals in brackets, mock-ups and the visualization of emotions and somatics by color, shape and size, and the running of imaginary situations in which the child's problem was successfully resolved. The problems under treatment varied from chronic headaches and skin rashes to reading blocks, compulsive hostility and competitiveness, general "parent trouble", and secrecy computations.

In the cases described, permanent release of the major difficulty was obtained in from five minutes to two hours of auditing. Of particular interest was the case of a twelve-year-old girl, scarred by body rashes, which were found to be tied in with the child's fear of disagreements with her mother. A few hours of processing relieved the situation; and occasional recurrences of the rashes in the following two years have been easily handled by the young preclear through self-processing.

Joanna Walsh then presented the manner in which Scientology Council handles the fact that the difficulties of a "problem member" of a family, whether child or adult, is based in part on his or her relations with every other member of the family group. Generally, after the initial consultation and the first processing session with the preclear, the wife, mother, or other family members are con-

tacted privately and persuaded to obtain enough processing for themselves to enable them to understand the difficulties of the preclear, and the manner in which they can best cooperate with the auditor to help the preclear through the processing period. Families who are genuinely concerned with the preclear's welfare are usually willing to do this, and a single session with each member of the group is frequently all that is required for the purpose.

The speaker stressed that understanding and resolving the present-time environmental entanglements of the preclear is an essential part of the auditing procedure. She cited several cases in which "family processing" indicated that entire family groups were involved in serious past-life complications.

During the intermission, one of the features of the evening we overheard being discussed was Ray Kinney's half-hour of experimental group processing, which used an "I am free to change my mind about...." approach. Typical comments were to the effect that a release from restrictive thinking had been experienced by those following the exercise.

(Cont. from P 3) People are waiting for data on Dianetics so that they can start applying Dianetics themselves. And the Records Research Program is designed for just this, to collect, analyze, and publish Dianetics' data.

This is what needs to be done: a) fill out a Quik Chek Personal Inventory on every p.c., b) including applicable medical records (eg, medical exams), c) including psychological test records, before and after, and d) send the Quik Chek Personal Inventory in to the Records Research Program.

Quik Chek Personal Inventories are available free through the CADA or the author. Psychological tests are available at cost at same place. Medical records you will have to arrange yourselves.

An additional need is for local representatives of this program. Qualified

people with a background in psychological testing or statistics are needed to administer certain aspects of this program locally. For details, write the author.

The future belongs to those who prepare for it. So let's get going on preparing!

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## EXPERIMENT FOUR

Editor's note: This is the fourth and concluding part of Experiment Four. From time to time other reports on the progress of Casey will be published. In a few months an article on Casey's little sister is planned.

His father feels that the one factor in Casey's development which may make him a problem later on is his certainty that he is right. This does not always fall in with the family plans. For example, he will call for his breakfast at six A.M.

His father says that if one were to use one word to describe the differences between Casey and his baby sister, and other children, (including their older brothers) that one word would be "sparkle".

While others have "sparkle" occasionally, Casey and his sister, who also had a dianetic birth, have it continuously.

Since Christmas, Casey has been recounting occasionally what appear to be either "past lives" or future lives. For example, he told about a time "when I am grown-up", when he cooked meat on a stick over a fire and ate berries. He told of another time when he was operating a machine, not all-glass, not all-wood, not all-metal, but made of all three, with his "electric hands". This too was "when I am grown". A little friend was taken to the hospital with an illness and Casey said that if he could just get to him, he could cure him with his "electric hands". Asked by his father where his electric hands are, he said, keeping his body's hands in his pockets, "up here," and then, "all around me".

The family does not foster the Santa Claus legend, but gives gifts at Christmas time to each other. However, altho Casey does not believe in Santa Claus,

he has been careful not to invalidate in any way any of his friends' beliefs in this benign myth.

Report of a visit of Casey to Ye Editor:  
Recently I had the pleasure of meeting Casey in person. His father brought him and an older brother, 8, to the office for a short visit. My first impression of Casey was his masculinity and apparent certainty. Mell, the father, suggested I ask Casey some questions. I did this in spite of my feeling that he wasn't overly anxious to answer them. Nor was he particularly irritated by them. "What do you want to be when you grow up?" Shrugged shoulders "I don't know." "How do you like my office?" "All right." "Do you like cockroaches?" "No." "Do you think they should have the right to live like everything else?" "Yes." All answers were either not forthcoming at all, were represented by shoulder shrugs, or monosyllables. Soon he closed up altogether and I attracted his attention to the E meter. He was intrigued by his ability to move the needle by squeezing the electrode. Before long he moved over to a comic book and his older brother took on the E meter.

He hasn't used his "electric hands" yet because the friend in the hospital was released and taken to another location without Casey seeing him.

His father later said that on the way home he made the following comment regarding his visit: "Too many questions, so I locked my head up."

He also commented on the fact that the books had had no pictures in them, and that he didn't get to work the controls on the recorder. Wayne and I, he said, were "fine fellows".

SOME LEGAL NOTES  
Privileged Communication

Most states now consider the relation between a doctor and his patient as a vital and intimate one. Under the old common law confidences between doctors and patients were not privileged. Thus, if a patient revealed certain confidential information to his doctor, the latter was obliged to disclose it, if asked to do so on the witness stand. Under certain conditions this rule still prevails, but as a result of changes by statute, the doctor is not allowed to disclose communications from a patient or give information concerning him, when such information is acquired professionally. The conditions that surround a privileged communication are: (a) the communication must originate with the understanding it will not be disclosed; (b) this element of confidence must be essential to the full and (continued on Page 12)

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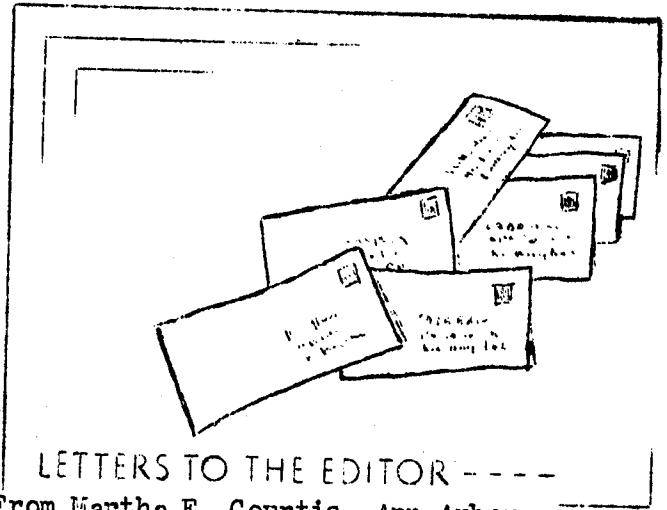

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

FROM: Remington Stone, HDA, Pasadena, California. . . . "Approximately five years ago, the book Dianetics was published. In it the author contributed three basic ideas, which, while not entirely new, were here shown for the first time in their proper relationships.

"This book led to many thousands of people using these basic ideas as stepping stones toward acquiring a knowledge of the way the subconscious mind works, how it acquires its content and how to remove the control of the subconscious mind over the thought and life of the individual. The work of these thousands of researchers has greatly expanded the data set out in the book, and has opened up many new areas and supplied simpler and more direct methods. The author of Dianetics has continued his research and has also published many techniques which make the work simpler and quicker.

"The final sentence in the book implores the readers to get busy and build a better bridge.

"However, the only international association is one tightly controlled by the author and so authoritarian that it seeks to prevent discussion, new ideas and criticism and to rigidly control all those interested in this new field. It apparently wants to treat dianetics as if it were a patented and 'owned' process, rather than a contribution to knowledge and the beginnings of a new science to which many have now contributed.

"This unreasoning attitude has forced many of the most capable and earnest people interested in what appears to be humanity's most promising field of investigation and development out of the organization, and has caused many in disgust to leave the field entirely.

"Since the California Association of Dianetic Auditors is the oldest and possibly the only remaining independent organization of individuals interested in dianetics, it is hereby proposed:

"1. That the C.A.D. A. incorporate an 'Association of Dianetic Auditors' of which the C.A.D.A. will be a unit, and that it invite those throughout the world who would like an independent organization to join it either as individuals or as groups.

"2. That this proposal be printed in the C.A.D.A. Bulletin and circulated to all known groups and to all interested periodicals with permission to reprint it entirely.

"3. That other groups and individuals be invited to express their opinions regarding these proposals.

"4. That, if the interest warrants it, members throughout the world be invited to elect officers or directors of the independent association, and to submit new ideas, criticisms and discussion for publication."
