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#### Award of Merit

Most of you HDA's have friends who are interested in dianetics. Some of them would make excellent HDA's as observed by the fine book auditing they have done. This Award of Merit, given by the Hubbard Dianetic Research Foundation to qualified non-Professional Auditors, will consist of one week's professional training at the Foundation. All living and transportation expenses will be covered by an accompanying financial grant for this period. And at the end of the week, the

student will be given a certification test to see if he is yet qualified to become a Hubbard Dianetic Auditor.

Qualifications for the award will include stipulations that the grantee have released at least five (5) cases of chronic somatics or chronic neuroses. This must be supported by evidence in the form of medical records, psychiatric or psychometric examinations if possible, and relevant Xrays, etc. Cases should be sent into Research as soon as they are prepared, where they will be examined and credited to the auditor sending them in.

This is a preview of an announcement to be made in the Bulletin in its special holiday issue that we told you about last week. Upon publication of this news in the Bulletin, the above information will become effective. It's not too early, however, for your auditing friends to start building up their case history files and submitting the results to Donald H. Rogers, Director of Research P.O. Box 502, Elizabeth, N.J.
