140 "CELEBRATE" RON'S RETURN TO WIDE OPEN SPACES

In perfect mid-winter weather, approximately 140 persons were in attendance at the International Congress of Scientologists and Dianeticists, held at the Little Theater in Phoenix, December 29 to 31, inclusive.

One of the unusual features of the Western Congress was the minimum of lecturing. Instead, the majority of the lecture time was spent in auditing the assembly as a group by L. Ron Hubbard. It was his announced intention, at the opening session, to "clear" as many in the audience as possible during the four days, and to carry this out, even the evening seminars were abandoned in favor of group auditing by Mr. Hubbard, working from the stage. The new technique, 8-C, offered primarily for persons who have been exteriorized, was used.

Although it was not a cleared audience, there were several who exteriorized for the first time-- and many of those participating have been classified as "tougher than a salad made of the First Book and fed to a toothless infant."

The Congress marked the return of Mr. Hubbard to Phoenix after more than a year's absence in London and on the Continent. By

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coincidence, Mr. and Mrs. Hubbard were able to lease again their former desert home at the foot of Camelback Mountain. Their return to Phoenix was high-lighted by a burglary, in which nothing, apparently, was taken. (A rumored hunt for the mythical "Ex-Calibur"?)

The Congress was capped by a New Year's Eve party at one of the largest hotels in Phoenix.

Monday, January 4, the Clinical Course was to open in Phoenix, and 10 students were chosen from more than 35 applicants. Quarters for the office of the H. A. S. and the Clinic and School were leased at 616 North Third Street, a building vacated a couple months ago by Dr. Gordon Beckstead, a psychologist, when he moved his operations to Howestown, Colorado.

Majority of the delegates to the Congress were from California and the Southwest, but there also was a fair representation from other sections of the United States: Detroit, Chicago, and the Pacific Northwest.

Burke Belknap Jr. managed the Western Congress and is in charge of the Phoenix Clinical School.

There were two girls from England and a man from New Zealand attending the lectures.

It seems that the Edetic Weekly, published by Jim Welges at Fairhope, Alabama has degenerated from about a ten-16 page letter to one sheet of nothing but mimeo book ads. The last copy received in the Ghost's offices had one sheet of two pages, with one third of the copy devoted to the sale of mimeo books by Welges, about 20 in number, ranging from 25¢ to \$5.00 and a course in Hexology for \$15.00. Another third was devoted to the validation of Ron Howes and the ballance was advertising "nuts" for sale, shelled or not shelled!

With Phoenix and Camden, this will make seven schools in this country, whereas there were only two before Ron returned and held the Conferences and Clinical Courses

Has just reported to the Ghost that their Doctorate School was opened on January 1, and that they will be giving the Doctorate Course along with the HCA course and another course for beginners who know nothing at all about Dianetics and Scientology. They don't know just how long the beginners course will take at this time, as setting up plans are not yet completed.

The H.C.A. Course may be completed in 4 weeks days, 8 weeks, evenings. (either) The Doctorate Course takes 8 to 12 weeks days or 16 to 24 weeks, evenings or 30 weeks, week-ends.

The latest Clinical course tapes are included in the doctorate course and all students will receive professional auditing and co-auditing. They are making a special concession to HDAs who wish to come into Scientology.

Dr. Young was a professional psychologist before entering the field of Scientology, and is late of the Doctorate Course in Philadelphia and the first Clinical Course in Camden. He is the Director.

The above Clinical Course is the one in which L. Ron Hubbard has just returned from abroad with the very latest data and techniques for rapid theta and MEST clearing.

The class lasts for six weeks and the fee to attend is \$800.00. The certification is the award of an Hubbard Graduate Auditor, (HGA) The next highest rating above an HGA is the D. Scn. which has to come from a recognized university in Europe.

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FOURTH CLASS OF THE CLINICAL COURSE TO BE HELD IN PHOENIX WILL START FEBRUARY 15th.

The Fourth and last class of the clinical course to be held in this country by L. Ron Hubbard, will start in Phoenix on February 15th. There are already eight signed up for this course at this writing, January 18th.

Anyone wishing to enter this class should write to Burke Bellmap, 1029 East Mareposa, Phoenix, Arizona at once and make their reservations, as only a limited number will be accepted and there will not be another class held for at least a year in the U. S. Ron will be returning to England after the course is finished on April 1st.

Word from Phoenix says that the third class is running lots faster and that students are becoming clear with many "fewer" hours than in earlier classes.. The new techniques are getting the bugs ironed out of them now and are running as smooth as clockwork.. There have been, so far as we can learn, no changes in techniques since the Philadelphia Conference, but students are learning how to apply them, which seems to be something that one can't learn too well from the PABs alone. This course is to clear the student and teach him how to apply the latest techniques. Theta Clearing is guaranteed!

But don't go to this course if you don't like to work, as it starts at 8 A.M. and lasts until 11:30 P.M. six days a week, and one is supposed to listen to tapes all day Sunday and get some auditing also!

LETTER FROM REG GOULD (EX-DIRECTOR
HAS LONDON) TO HAS LONDON BULLETIN

Dear Friends,

The termination of my services and the entrustment of the execution of HAS policy to a Committee of Management has caused a deal of stir. A short rundown on past events is called for.

On March 15 of this year first aid to the British Operation was necessary as we were passing through a crisis at the end of the lean winter months. The cost of communication was rising fast and the lag in income was more than a young organisation however healthy - could stand.

As the man at the centre of communication and data, I considered what red lights I should pass and with the exception of those that would result in counter-effort from outside authorities in education and the medical profession, etc., I passed all the red lights with my foot on the floorboards.

Some of those red lights came straight from L. Ron Hubbard.

A letter from Camden, New Jersey arrived on November 7th.

"Dear Mr Gould,

As of Monday, November 9th, this letter is to give one week's notice of the termination of your employment with the Hubbard Association of Scientologists of Great Britain.

Your services have been greatly appreciated and it is with regret that is necessary at this time to end such.

To the many friends who tried to change the mockup - and they were far

more numerous than I had a right to expect after ten months of my rather harsh administration - I express deep gratitude. I have prominently in mind the propagation of Scientology in Australia where I have many staunch friends and where the soil is fertile.

This letter is by no means one of farewell; neither is it an invitation to dissenting voices. We are well on the way to achieving many important goals and unity in the field accelerates our progress. ...AND HERE ARE SOME CASE HISTORIES

Dear Clem,

I'm writing this to the accompaniment of the raucous cries of sea-gulls; possibly the same sound is present as you read it. I must throw my weight into the general agreement and congratulate you most sincerely on the reality you demonstrate in the "Ghost". I, and I speak for some thirty-five very active scientologists, would like to be haunted by it for as long as you can manage to produce it. You seem to have coupled Sanity and Dignity with a mature responsible sense of humour that is wholly delightful, as well as being extremely valuable as a means of sharing others' realities. More power to you, Clem - anything you want - any time - just ask.

There is a quotation that goes -
"If it's difficult it may take time,
but if it's impossible it may take
a little longer."

That's how we feel about this work and all who dedicate themselves to it - anything we can do, we will.

I have enclosed a couple of case histories which may be of use in reversing the flow of rubbish with which you seem to be bombarded. I notice that all sorts of publications ask for case histories and I think the main reason they are not forthcoming is the very wise attitude of Professional Auditors in not wanting to be associated with the horrible infantile drivel that pours from the reactive bank of these so-called editors.

Here in the Channel Islands Scientology is on a very sound footing. I studied under Ron in London and have maintained very close communication since my return. We formed a group in June '55 and since then have taken over large premises and opened an associate school

and a clinic.

Just a point about data, Clem. Any Most object or facsimile, including the body, would seem to be basically a concept with either or all of three significances; Utility, Aesthetic, and Emotional. It is the Emotional significance that would be the most aberrative to Homo Sapiens, as it hits him between the thought and effort band, thereby causing action based solely on stimulus response. Should this action be arrested because of the difference between the community tone level and the newly restimulated tone level of the P/C, then the glandular secretions caused by the emotion would not be used up in the action and would then form into deposits and cause disease such as rheumatoid arthritis, gall-stones, skin disease, etc.

These latest techniques of Ron's dealing in differentiation soon throw up the significance, and the whole mechanism becomes obvious to the preclear with consequent cutting out of the emotional restimulation. This little dissertation would imply that I am concentrating on psychosomatic illness, and the Most body, but that would be incorrect. It's just an angle which has helped me understand what is happening, and has happened to my preclear.

Why all this frantic squabbling around deep down in the festering swamp of data is going on I fail to understand. Ron gave us the Factors and we should know very well that it is Simplicity we are after, not complexity; in those words I feel lies the direction of enlightenment.

I have studied the work of Max Freedom Long, Clem, and have a very interesting angle on the point where the data slips sideways. Maybe you'd like to read it some time.

As you know, the secretary of this group is Miss V. Le Couteur. A very able woman who is at present two-thirds through the professional course and possessing a very extensive background of study, should prove to be yet another

militant factor in the race to free mankind.

Compliments of the season to you, Clem - may this New Year prove to be optimum.

CASE HISTORIES: AUDITOR, RON C. YOUNG, I. P. A., Ph. D., 16 David Place, St. Helier, Jersey, C. I.

Case No. DP/RCY/T27

Female: Age 47. Married. 1 child. Slight build. About average intelligence.

When first seen this preclear was in deep apathy to the extent that she was shut up in a small dark room away from all light, and to venture out she would cover her eyes with cotton wool pads.

Almost every joint in her body was deformed and contorted with Rheumatoid Arthritis and her eyes were pouring with water. The sight of one eye was gone and a film was appearing over the other. The tongue had thickened, making her almost inarticulate, and she was too weak to hold a cup of tea. This condition had existed for over eight years, during which time she had received treatment along orthodox medical lines (details with HAS, London). She was currently under the observation of three local doctors.

At the first visit an hour or more was spent establishing some sort of communication during which an extenuating circumstance came to light. She was computing along the lines of, "all forms of treatment were painful", and after two abortive attempts - (one by spiritualists and another by a hypnotist) her condition further deteriorated; consequently she tended to refuse communication about any attempt to cure her, and to use her own words, "just wanted to be left alone."

I asked her if she had known that I was to visit her, and she said "Yes". I then questioned her as to whether she had visualized the visit before it had happened, and she again said "Yes".

From then on, the conversation went as follows:

A. Can you always picture things you're going to do?
 Pc. Not always. Mostly it's things that have happened before.

A. When you picture anything, do you see colour?

Pc. Oh, yes, I do this all day when the pain isn't too bad, but you know, I faint with the pain at times.

A. Where is the pain worst at the moment?

Pc. My arm. It's as if the nerves were being dragged out.

A. Can you picture your arm?

Pc. Not from the outside, but I can see the bone if I close my eyes.

(This was good news as it meant she had a reality on her own universe and made the processing much simpler).

A. All right! just close your eyes and get a nice clear picture of the arm.

(She had become absorbed in what we were doing and was communicating well by now).

It was found that she could work with beams and explosions and was eager to do so. That night she slept well and appeared at the clinic as arranged next day. The next five two-hour sessions were devoted to removing black ridges from the pain areas and the eyes. She was then switched over to SOP 8 and Certainty Processing with some anchor point drill - a total of twenty hours spread over two weeks.

The result of this was fantastic to watch. The sight of her eyes improved, the swellings in the joints went down, the pain disappeared, and her tone soared up. She has free movement in most joints now and the deformities

levelling out to normal. In the opinion of her friends and relatives she has lost fifteen years in appearance. The facial muscles have relaxed and she no longer wears dark glasses.

This case, in my opinion, would have given the most hardened cynic, critical of L. Ron Hubbard's work, such a reality on Scientology and an insight into his fellow man that he would have dared all to embrace the science.

The staggering effect of processing was best shown in the incredible speed with which the later techniques worked; it was literally a visible transformation.

Full details, including previous medical history are available with the auditor and full discussion anytime will be welcomed.

Case No. DP/RCY/F14. Asthma.

Female: Age 8 years. Husky built girl, good at school but subject to severe asthmatic spasms which paralysed the chest and throat.

The head was carried in a cramped, tucked-in fashion with the chin down on the chest. The child wheezed badly while breathing.

Eight hours, in four periods of two, using Gita on different domestic items (feeding them into the chest, then taking them right out) relieved this condition....The following letter is from the father, and explains his reaction to her present condition. The name of the General Medical Practitioner who was attending this case is lodged with H/S London.

"I would like to place on record the results of your Dianetic Treatment on my 8 year old daughter.

"She had been having Asthma attacks for over 6 years in which time some half a dozen doctors had treated her. Since you treated her in June (a course of 8 treatments) she has only suffered one attack, this not as serious as before. It cleared after a further two treat-

ments. Since you first saw her, I have not sent for, or taken her to, a doctor.

"There can be no doubt whatever of her general improvement. I thank you for your generous consideration of her case, and wish well to the Hubbard Association and yourself."

Case No. DP/RCY/H10. Psoriasis:

Male: Age 36. Heavily built; very determined, down-to-earth man. Married. Not happy. Managing director of transport company.

This preclear was suffering from Psoriasis, a scaly skin complaint which produces huge, ugly patches of red, damp skin covered with silver flakes. Over one-third of the preclear's total skin area was covered by the disease and had been for over twenty-two years. He had spent a great deal of time and money at various skin hospitals, and attending leading skin specialists, all without effect. (Details with H/S London).

Treatment was ten hours creative processing, using items from the list of known aberrative items of expanded Gita. (SOP 8, Step LV).

The significant items were quickly discovered by asking the preclear to just think about each of the listed things in turn, whilst holding the E-meter cans. This method brought to light six surges on the meter. The corresponding items were then used in creative processing, and the condition disappeared. It is now six months since this case cleared up without trace of a re-occurrence.

(Note: Four cases of this disease have been treated, and a further two are at present in processing stage).

THE THREE CASES LISTED ABOVE are picked from a list of 44 such cases worked on in the last seven months. Others are: Bed-wetting, migraine,

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varicose ulcers, nervous twitchings, screaming at night (child), falling hair, excess fat, sexual incompatability, anxiety neurosis, (suicidal tendencies), stuttering, backward child, eczema, deafness, masturbation, ulcerated foot, catarri, compulsions. Assists have been given in cases of split tibia (bone of lower leg); sprain; and grief over death. Great strides are being made with a case of paralysis, also a complicated case with psoriasis, arthritis and deafness. In addition to the above, 12 proclears are in the process of being cleared to theta clear.

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SCIENTOLOGY IS YOUR SOLUTION

(An article by Stanley Richards, H.P.A., H.G.A., reprinted from "For Your Information" a bulletin issued by HAS London)

Every great advance of man has been brought about by an advance of knowledge. The catastrophes which have overtaken so many civilizations have come about not because of what men knew, but because of what they did not know. Man succeeds where he knows; he fails where he is ignorant.

Our western civilization is a prosperous one. We have warm and lighted cities which protect us from the more drastic elements of nature. We have communication networks of high efficiency. Our ability to produce the material needs of life is greater than that of any civilization which has gone before us. And because of our superlative conquest of nature we have more remittance from the grinding toil of scraping an existence from the earth than that which has been the lot of civilizations of the past.

But in spite of all this there has been a gap in our knowledge; there is an area of unknown, a blind spot, which could kill us as dead as any civilization of the past which has succumbed to this cold unreasoning universe. In spite of our many proud and knowledgable sciences there is

something in this universe of tremendous power, which, because we have no real knowledge of it, is running wild completely out of control. There is a missing science; and because of this all the sciences tremble on a knife-edge of uncertainty.

There is no science of that beingness which is man. We have learned many things but we do not know how we know anything. We have very little idea of what that life is that is ourselves. We do not know where we have come from or where we are going. We do not know if we are Gods or mud!

We have somet hing called biology. But this study admits at every turn that it does not know what life is. It has no simple explanation and it has given up trying to find out. Because of this, biology is beset by theories so complex that it reminds one of nothing so much as Ptolomaic astronomy before the advent of Newton. Everywhere there are pockets of unrelated investigation. So that a simple man who wanted to know what life was all about might plough through the study of cells, the theories of evolution, social science, social psychology, individual psychology, psychoanalysis and, finding such a welter of unsatisfactory explanations, might look into mysticism, occultism, and the Society for Psychical Research; and in the end be wiser only in this: he would be quite sure that no one knew!

All these fields have gathered interesting data, but they do not add up to anything. It has even become the fashion in many scientific circles to believe that they should not add up to anything. The great scientists of the past might well turn in their graves if they but knew how this bored sophistication had taken hold of our intelligences.

Scientology has not been given its name in a moment of idle enthusiasm. It is a line of investigation which no one has ever taken before and it has delivered us knowledge in a way which we have never had.

Science has made the most astonishing omission. It has always assumed that any subject of study must always be something objective, something uninterfered with by an observer. Why was it forced to impose such a severe limitation upon itself? Obviously because there was something unknown about the observer. Man's own creativeness has been the thing which has been of most trouble to him. One had to investigate the objective, agreed universe because as soon as you looked into the observer, the mind of man, you were immediately unsure. "We have to find out how things are apart from what we think." That decision was because man was afraid of his own mind, fearful of his own capabilities. Yet all the time, his "finding out" was an act of his own mind.

The crisis had to come sooner or later; and we may be thankful that the crisis is over. It was really over the moment Hubbard assumed that the problem of the human mind could be solved. We do not readily realize what a tremendous victory of the spirit that was in an age where there was no one to agree with him that it could be done. On the contrary, there was everything to encourage him to believe the opposite. For what he called "a solution" was so far above anything conceived by those who styled themselves as studying the mind that their scholastically dignified pessimism must have been considerably outraged.

Scientology has come a long way from its early discoveries in the field of memory. It gained workable laws as to the relation of viewpoints to space, time, and energy which are so profoundly simple; and which enable us at one stroke to deduce so much phenomena that one catches oneself apologising to people for being able to understand so much. Things as wide apart as the growth of a living cell to the experience of the mystic are found to be possible under the same set of natural laws. The only reason these laws are difficult to communicate is because they are so extremely simple that the temptation to add unnecessary complex-

ities to them is too much for most people. They have learned that life is a complicated thing to understand; so that a teacher or writer in this subject does well to spend a good deal of time explaining why we do not have to complicate matters with unnecessary theories.

It is easy to see, then, why it is that an auditor is confident that there is no problem in his preclear which he cannot deal with; why he feels that there is no one so well that he cannot bring into a higher state of beingness. He knows that the preclear sitting in front of him is trying to live and be self-determined. He knows that he is a viewpoint trying to survive in the physical universe, and he knows that the reality has probably smashed into him so often that his self-determinism is shot to pieces. He knows that this preclear has probably had to face reality and give up his illusions, which is to say he has little hope left. The auditor knows that because his preclear can no longer create his own universe and that reality of this one, which others so thoughtfully made him face, has probably grown dimmer and less real than when he was a child. The auditor knows that those around this preclear in the past have not always been as sane as they might be - and he knows what memory can do to an individual. Yet in spite of all this the auditor knows that he is dealing with a responsible being, and that there is nothing that this being cannot put right with a little aid, under his own steam.

To the auditor, the body and the mind of the preclear are just so much physical universe energy. The beingness of the preclear is something different, and all this energy is under this being's control to a greater or lesser extent. The body and the mind are nothing more than memory, which itself is nothing more than the suspension of energy particles held in place and organized by that beingness or viewpoint.

You will see from this why the auditor

does not merely consider himself a psychotherapist. And it is evident why there is no physical or mental problem that he will not tackle. His science cuts across the old distinction. However, he recognises the value of medicine, for example, when it is viewed in its proper perspective.

It is no good trying to audit a man under a bus who is pumping out quarts of blood into the gutter. But it is interesting to note that if this man's reaction time had been better, that if he had not been pre-occupied as he crossed the road, he would not be under the bus. Can you say that being under the bus was a psychosomatic illness? Well, in the long view, yes. But what that fellow wants right now is a doctor!

I once mentioned to a medical practitioner Hubbard's remark that 90 percent of illness is psychosomatic. "Nonsense," said the doctor, "99 per cent!"

In Scientological work we are hitting at the roots of illness and insanity. With our new-found knowledge we hope to help men and women towards a healthier, happier state, to head society towards survival and abundance of living.

The knowledge has been put into our hands. It is up to each one of us to learn our subject and use it to help ourselves and those around us.

Dear Sirs, Etc:

I wonder if you are aware of the joy felt by your colleagues in the field on receiving the great news that you had produced an actual Clear? I myself could not wait for my copy of PROLOGUE TO SURVIVAL, containing the verbatim report on a dianetic quorum led by this optimum human being. Along with my congratulations, I would like to take the liberty of telling you of a discovery based on my own experiences and the information contained in the PROLOGUE TO SURVIVAL, in the hope that it may be of help to you in producing additional clears.

A few weeks ago, we in New York brought an individual to the same, optimum state. Your success, together with ours, has revealed to us a datum that is rather striking. It seems that homo novis, being fully self-determined, is a highly individualized being; unlike homo sapiens, who is only partly self-determined and for the most part, group determined. Yet there are traits in the fully self-determined state, traits found in our own clear, which are so similar to your clear that I can't help but feel you should be informed of them. Possibly when we have a definite idea of just what can be expected of a clear we will have a better working knowledge of just what constitutes what kind of behavior is aberrative behavior; and with this knowledge work more quickly toward its elimination. In other words, we will have a more precise idea of just what it is we are after.

It is with this purpose in mind that I am sending herewith a report of a dianetic forum conducted by our own clear, and this report is a verbatim transcript of the tapé recording. All who have met our clear and heard him speak are of the same opinion—they feel that here, indeed, is someone

who is totally unlike the ordinary individual.

I'll let you judge for yourself. Ron Lox is the name of our clear, and this is the transcript:

Ron: Good evening. You see me now as something quite different than at our last meeting. A clear does not remain the same. Some of you who are not quite stupid enough to occlude all your perceptics may have observed that I have a very bad cold. What you don't know is that since I saw you last I have also grown four warts and a very annoying chest rash. All this, I did on purpose. And, I could turn all these things off if I wanted to. I simply don't want to....All right, let's have some of your idiotic questions...

Tom: Sir, do you have SONIC?

Ron: That's it—the more idiotic the better. I'd like to see a show of hands on this: how many felt an electric current flow through their meagre brains over the weekend? It started off like a slight chill, then felt as if a rat had caught fire and was running around inside your skull. Then it ended on a sharp, piercing pain with a lot of little lights dancing before your eyes. Well... no hands? What's the matter, frightened? All right, that's better. Everybody got that signal then. Any more questions?

Dick: Please Sir, I was wondering if...

Ron: Anybody know what counter-emotion is? Who can give a definition?

Harry: I believe I can, Sir. Do you want me to try to define it, Sir?

Ron: If you want to, you will. If you don't, you won't. You are fully self-determined. Right now, you are determined to be aberrated.

Harry: Oh, Sir, I well appreciate that fact, but Sir, isn't counter-emotion when—ah—somebody says something and they're at 1.0, and immediately you sort of...

COPY: LETTER TO PRT (CONT'D)

Ron: So you can see, can't you, the hopelessness of this specimen ever becoming clear? To get back to the signal sent out over the weekend, it was sent by a machine which I am working on. This machine, after I have run out the last time I was accused of not being clear, will enable me to get to the planet Uranus before I actually start. Not that I have any respect for Uranium, but the last time I was up there I left my hat. Getting there before I start will be simple. It's done by means of the time switch, which I perfected myself. And which puts the future here before the past....All of you, naturally, are stuck in the past. So it would be pointless to explain it if I wanted to, which I don't. But the machine itself is wonderful. There's a special valve...

Tom: About us being stuck in the past—and all—can you tell us, Sir, how we might just unstick ourselves a little?

Ron: That I certainly can tell you, but I won't! —There's a special valve on this machine and it is entirely my own invention. I tried to get Consolidated Edison to design one for me and they didn't even know what a valve was. I had no knowledge whatsoever about valves myself, but I merely projected myself into space and there was the blueprint. Then I turned on a visio of the finished product, and fastened it on the machine by telekinesis....All I have to do now is twist the valve and beer runs out. And, do I love beer! Hubbard didn't know, or else did know and was afraid that preclears would take advantage of it, but the Ninth Dynamic is beer.

Dick: Please, Sir, I...

Ron: That's what I want—questions! I'm here to help you. —How to get back to the future...and I do mean get back because the future is actually before the past. And any idea that it is after the past is merely one of the horrible social postulates which I sincerely advise you to run out—if any of you were capable of running out

anything at all. I didn't have to run this myself. I simply keyed it out by means of the time switch. And, I can tell you, the future is wonderful! Being a full clear can be defined simply as: being alone, in the future, with a glass of beer. But there is interference. There will always be interference in this world of aberrees.

For example, I was enjoying a nice cool glass of beer next week when two men in white coats came in and tried to wrap me up in a wet sheet. Of course I could have handled that situation easily if I had wanted to, but I didn't want to. Would it have done any good to tell them that I was in Zone 64?...In an aberreated world you can never be truly, joyfully, alone, experiencing that wonderful feeling that can be described as nobody being with you, for any length of time (although time has no length, only breadth), without some dumb aberree stumbling around and falling against you. It seems that everywhere you go, there's somebody. The other day I went down to birth, thinking to get some delicious solitude there, and instead, I found my mother dramatizing birth pains in order to get sympathy. That's the real value of lock scanning, incidentally; you're never in one incident long enough to spend more than a split second in anybody's company. And anybody who tries to grab me as I go by gets a 20,000 volt...

Dick: Oh, Sir...

Ron: ...gets a 20,000 volt beam right in his dirty face! And another thing—it would be bad enough if they were clears, these people who will not let you alone, but how many are there who have reached the state of us clears? No, these people are the lowest of the low—aberrees who haven't the decency, nor enough margin of prime thought to get out of the universe and...

Dick: Please, Sir, I wanted to find out if it's necessary to run birth?

Ron: Go to hell and find out!...the decency to leave our universe and let

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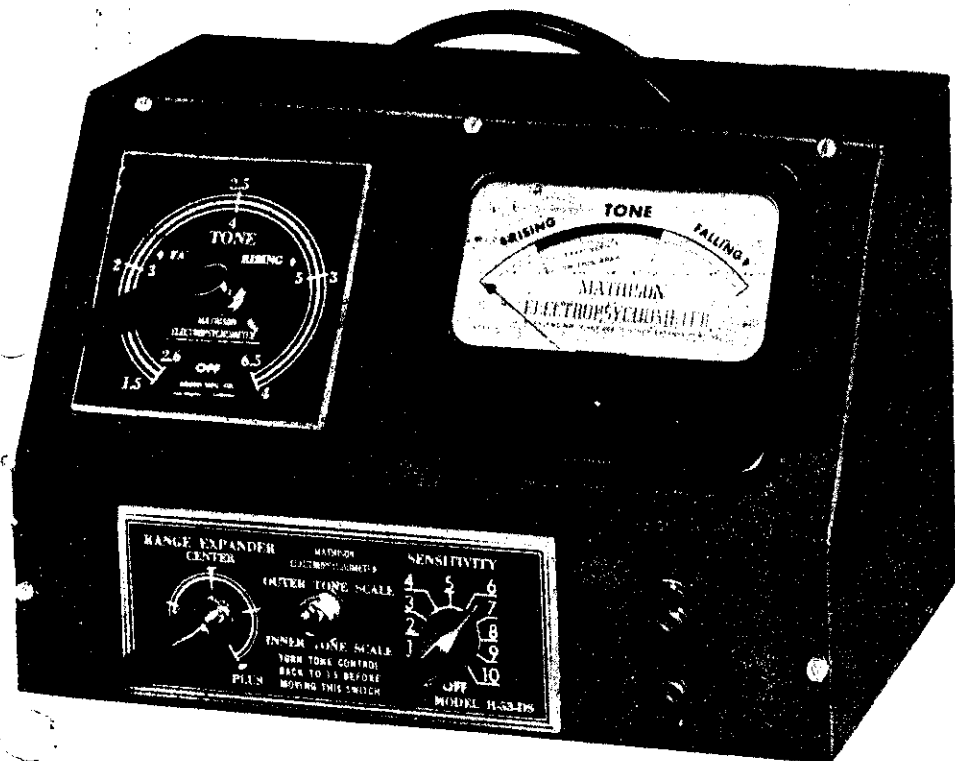
