THE GAME ANXIETIES --- WIN AND LOSE, RESPOSIBILITY AND APPROVAL BY FRANKLIN S. SULLIVAN

# DEFINITION

An anxiety is herein defined as a terrible feeling that something one considers must happen will not happen; or that what one feels must not happen will happen. It comes about on a feeling that one must control and cannot. Anxieties come about as, from the viewpoint of the Thetan the game deteriorates.

# THE GAME ANXIETIES

A game is a game as long as it contains interest. Anxiety is interest that has turned sour and solid. We call the anxieties upon win and lose, responsibility, and approval game anxieties, because these are the anxieties occurrent in the deterioration of the game. Further, their presence causes a deterioration of the ability of the player to play the game. They come about primarily with a major disruption of the Look to Action Sequence. This is, per Issue 10, Lookingness, Thought, Emotion, Effort, Action, to create an effect upon Solids.

## OTHER LANXIETIES

There are many other anxieties, which form into two general categories. The first is upon above game attitudes such as appear on the top line of the attitude chart, which comes with the Handbook For Preclears, by L. Ron Hubbard, such as truth, am, always, etc. These may effect man, and do key in under peculiar circumstances. They do not constitute the magnitude of obstruction to the sanity and ability of the being that the game anxieties bring about. The similarities and differences between Responsibility as it appears on the Attitude Chart, and Responsibility as herein denoted, will be thoroly discussed in the section on this subject.

The other category, the secondary anxieties are complications resultant from the Game Anxieties. Typical among these are the anxieties on appearance, position, survival, being judged, blame, good and evil, secrets, reality, communication, love and affinity, others derived from social agreement ad infinitum

# HISTORY

71.3 when Ron first developed Scientology, the premiere recognition was that man was basically a spirit; that if his status were to be improved, it can be done only to the degree that man betters himself as' a spirit. Ron developed processes designed to do this directly. He soon found that this approach was not successful in the achieving of of his goals. He found that it was necessary to address all that is man -- that man considers himself to be. He recognized that it was useless to process the reactive mind, directly, but that reactivity and reactive considerations cannot be by-passed. He then "deaded. south" as he calls, to reduce the totality of thetan plus bank, plus genetic entity, plus body to the levels of contollability necessary to free the "native" sanity and ability/of the thetan.

Our southernly madir has been passed with the effective application of God. H. processing, We can look forward toward the achieving of our driginal goals set by Ron bask in 1952. But, the processes to be used in our ascent will not be the ones formerly used, tho many of them will be most useful. The importance of the same, and the necessity of restoring the game condition is now realized, and processes are now aimed toward its restoration. Directly in the path of this progress lie the anxieties upon the game. THE FOUR STATUSES of the state of

In order to understand the relationship of these anxieties to. other data in Scientology, I have set up the chart, which will be found below. Many of our past confusions have been brought about by our inability to differentiate relative to the four statuses.

# ALIGNBUMT WITH SCIENTULOGY SCALES.

The Havingness Scale of the December 1956 Congress describes the states of Theta, as aberrated in the physical universes or what happens to the first column as it diminishes into the second, third and rourth columns.

The Willingness to Know to Unwillingness to Associate Scale appearing in Dianctics '55 refers to Thetan Located, or the second column.

The Thetan Scale that appears on pp. 51 of 8-80 includes the entire range of all Your statuses. The negative points of the scale are, or course, in the band of Selflessness-- or Theta-lessness. The Theta-Plus-Body range of this scale, above 2.0, refers to the second column; between 1.0 and 2.0 to the third column; below 1.0 to the rourth column.

# OPPONENTS, BARRIERS AND PUBPOSES

A game is a true game as long as it contains interest, and as long as there is an understanding of and a proper balance between opponents, barriers and purposes. This can obtain only to the extent that the Whotan is capable of true communication. As the ability to communicate deteriorates and lessos prevail, he tends to fight the

game. It is therein that he lights the game-- confuses the barriers with opponents. It is therein that the Game Anxieties come about You cannot lick the barriers of this physical universe game. Anxiety subsides, and he becomes "well-adjusted as he identifies himself with the game-- at the status of Selflessness.

MOTION

There is interest in a game to the extent that there is tolerable motion. Each thetan has a tolerance range of motion. If the motion is too fast, he will tend to feel overwhelmed, develop an anxiety, simultaneously receive fewer wins, develops more anxiety—and so on down, and out of the game. Further, this is accelerated by the keying in of past anxieties, which are even more effective in decreasing his tolerance range of motion.

If the speed of the game is too slow, he will intentionally reduce his knowingness to fit the game.

# DEI CYCLE OF GAMES

The DEI cycle of games is as follows: Can have wins, but willing to lose; must have wins; must have wins, but cannot have wins; cannot have wins. It is at the point of "must have wins," and wins become scarce that the anxiety upon wins and losses come about. It is, incidently, at this point that the element of pretense vanishes, and the same becomes very scrious.

complexities. A player is as good as ac is able to find these unknown will be pleasurable and adventurous to the extent that one does not have anxities upon them.

The thetan in a game condition does not have anxietics relative to certainties, because he has no particular identification with any of them. Conversely, it is only when he to some degree identifies himself with a certainty that he can possibly get an anxiety upon it.

In a true game, the opponents, barriers and purposes are known. All else may be uncertain, random and complex. A game deteriorates to the degree that there is unknowingness and confusion relative to opponents, barriers, purposes, also relative to these stable data and the above variables. It is herein that the game anxieties transpire. CERTAINTY

An uncertainty is defined by Ron as the product of two certainties. There nover can be an uncertainty, however, which is the product of one's own Theta-Determined certainties. These certainties are qualitative—not quantitative—are above the identification band, and we have no dependencies upon them. We can create them and destroy them at will. Uncertainties, as above defined are the product of either a Theta-Determined certainty and an other-determened certainty, or two other-dermined dertainties.

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# AN INTERVIEW WITH L. ROW HUBBARD

This interview was given in almost the ultimate of informality -even to the extent that it was never intended to be an interview at all. Upon the completion of an incidental matter, the writer, during a Validation Dourse brook, asked Ron if there were any remarks he wished to make about the HASI, for publication in The Second Terminal. Altho the HASI does quite a sales job in its own publications, it saidom talks about itself. Rom heartily agreed that this was in order.

The first specific question was, " How are HASI receipts expended?" Ron replied that a maximum of 50% is spent on wages. These average about 25% less than the going wages in the washington area wherein the classification is domparable. They are somotimes even lower when the HARI weekly income is low -- for, as per above -- they are nover more than 50% of the total income. Ron receives no insome from the MASI, subsists on the income from his writings, and other sources.

Operating expenses are allowed 25% of the budget. This includes everything from rein to office supplies, to all research, graduitous mailing of all scientological liverature to all universities who make 

it available to the public. As this activity is charged against the

book fund, the book fund invariably shows a loss.
The remaining 2.% is allocated for building fund and for emerging The average yearly income from all sources totals about \$250,000. and that just about equals the expenditures. There are 31 people on the staff at Washington, and 39 on the London start. Practically all of the income is derived from fees paid to the Washington creekisation for intensives and training. The organization is solvent and has been solvent for the past tive and one-half years.

There are not even any varue plans to move from Washington. Ron likes it here and plans so stare

The basic interest of the Gentral Organization is research, the discovery of more effective teabniques which will the fection assist men to become more same and able. The research budget is pitifully minute. however. Lon conducts, or at least supervises, all reaperch, himself. It is only when the errectiveness of a prosess has been soundly proved that it is released for use in the Guidence Center; lucorporated into the training program. The errectiveness of this amall research program is almost unbelievable.

Hon is most optimistic relative to the future. This is not new. The results that have been produced in the last several zonthu baye. given him sound cause for his optimism & Re expects the organization

to expand considerably in the near future of the life of the last been a long pull to get things running as smoothly as they are right now. It is the writer's appraisal that we do have an excellent organization, one that we dan be proud of. That dould not have been said two, three or five years ago.

# THE STABLE DATUM AND SCIENTOLOGY ... BY PRINKLES. SULLIVAN

In a true science, a stable datum is in the form of an hypothesis an assumption of Eruth, to be tested relative to its alignment with will increase in its magnitude and stability. Should the alignment not be accurate, it is corrected or rejected.

In a churchianity type of roligion, the stable data; in terms of dogme, creed, interpretation is considered imputable, ultimate truth and all that does not elign with it is rejected as untrue. It constitutes a limited frame of reforences or call it a limited playing field,

which restricts knowingness and understanding,

A body of true knowledge is consistent of much data of relative stability, caou so-related with one another. Such a body of knowledge is understood to the extent that those so-relations of data which make up the knowledge is understood. A true science gould be so defined. perrect soience would be one that had no such limitations whatover. theory, Scientelogy is such a science, as it has not limitation of frame of reference or playing field.

The only inneeded is in shore platity to play; that is, one! ability to know, understand, and Theta-Determined action. It diffors from my other game in the physical universe, of which we know. Its goal is to dissolve problems, so that we can then perceive bigger, more interesting ones. It seeks understanding rather than the addition of annihor altor-isness. Its goul is knowledge rather than perpetuation.

To the old reader of the Second Terminal, this might sound like a variation to an old tune. It is again mentioned because there are those in Scientology -- even in fairly high places -- who seem bent upon the regarding of Scientology as a single stable datum. They seem to be able to make little defferentiation between Ron Hubbard as a person, the organization, and the body of knowledge. This, of course, is a Churchianity attitude with which, to the best of my evidence, Ron does not concur.

In several conversations with Ron in Washington, I drew him out relative to his attitude on this matter. He believes that every one is basically good, that Scientology will remain in an optimum game condition to the extent that "freedom to" is allowed.

I also did my best to draw out from him criticism of anything which I had written, went out of my way to leave myself wide upen to any corrector errors that he may have believed that I made. He merely replied to the effect that the more people who looked at Scientology, wrote about it, the happier he would be. I mentioned, "Of course, I do not agree with you on the matter of pills politics, and a few similar matters—." He laughed and said that the pills had been forgotten, that the activity on the political party had provided valuable data which gave bases for a study on the third dynamic, which he is now conducting, and presently intends to release at the forthroming Congress. He has also set up a writing program, urges Scientologists to prepare manuscripts, and market them thru the HASI.

When a person has a single stable datum, he does not own it. It owns him. It is at the level of identification. So it is with those who hold Scientology as a single stable datum, tend to regard Ron and the organization as sacred. They do not own the body of knowledge of Scientology, have only a havingness on it—cannot reach toward it and withdraw from it at will.

--But this is a plea for understanding, not a condemnation. Let us start from the beginning, the bottom.

At the very bottom is he who can cognize upon no stable datum. As Hubbard mentioned in a recent lecture, insanity exists in the absence of a stable datum. Give an insane person a stable datum, and he is no longer insane. but he is far from able. He has found something that he can depend upon. His avowan of dependency upon the stable datum has alleviated his insanity. Correlectively, ability can be gradated in terms of the amount of stable data which a person can handle-- with pleasure.

Those members of Social Melec who first enter Scientology, do so seeking reasonable and consistent stable data One mantch move from the status of ordingary man to a point wherein he is capable of gaining qualitative certainty without first gaining the ability of gaining quantitative certainty. It is therefore necessary that Scientology present to them a firm and solid bulwark.

On the other hand, as one ascends the scale from homo sapiens to homo novis, gradually becomes capable of tolerating greater and greater motion, randomness, complexities, there is bound to be many levels of understanding of Scientology, not necessarily in context with the one above it, or the one below it. All concerned should seek to tolerate those whose realities upon the subject is different from their present one. We will gain to the extent that we maintain "freedom to" within Scientology.
